Good evening,

January has come and gone, but winter is here to stay! While we're embracing the season, I know many of us are eagerly awaiting the arrival of spring!

We're happy to share that in January, we covered 94% of our calls, responding to a total of 125 calls and providing care in 114 patient encounters. Our second ambulance continues to be a vital resource in ensuring our community receives timely emergency care.

Given the success of our second ambulance, we are expanding its availability on a trial basis. While we continue to staff the second ambulance on Mondays, Tuesdays, and Wednesdays, we've now added:

- ✓ Thursdays (daytime)
- ✓ Fridays (daytime)
- ✓ Every other Sunday (daytime)

Our goal is to make these additional shifts permanent in 2025. We are closely monitoring staffing and payroll costs to ensure this expansion remains sustainable while continuing to provide the highest level of service.

Looking ahead, we're excited to be expanding our American Heart Association (AHA) training program! We are actively working to build our instructor base and will soon be offering CPR and AED courses to our community. If you or someone you know needs a CPR class, please reach out—we would love to get you scheduled! We have a dedicated team of eager instructors ready to teach, and the more classes, the better!

As always, we are incredibly grateful for the support of our community and town residents. Your trust and encouragement drive us to provide the best care possible.

The following chart is the average response time based on the call acuity and the township. Please note that "Alpha" priority calls are the lowest priority based on the dispatch triage system.

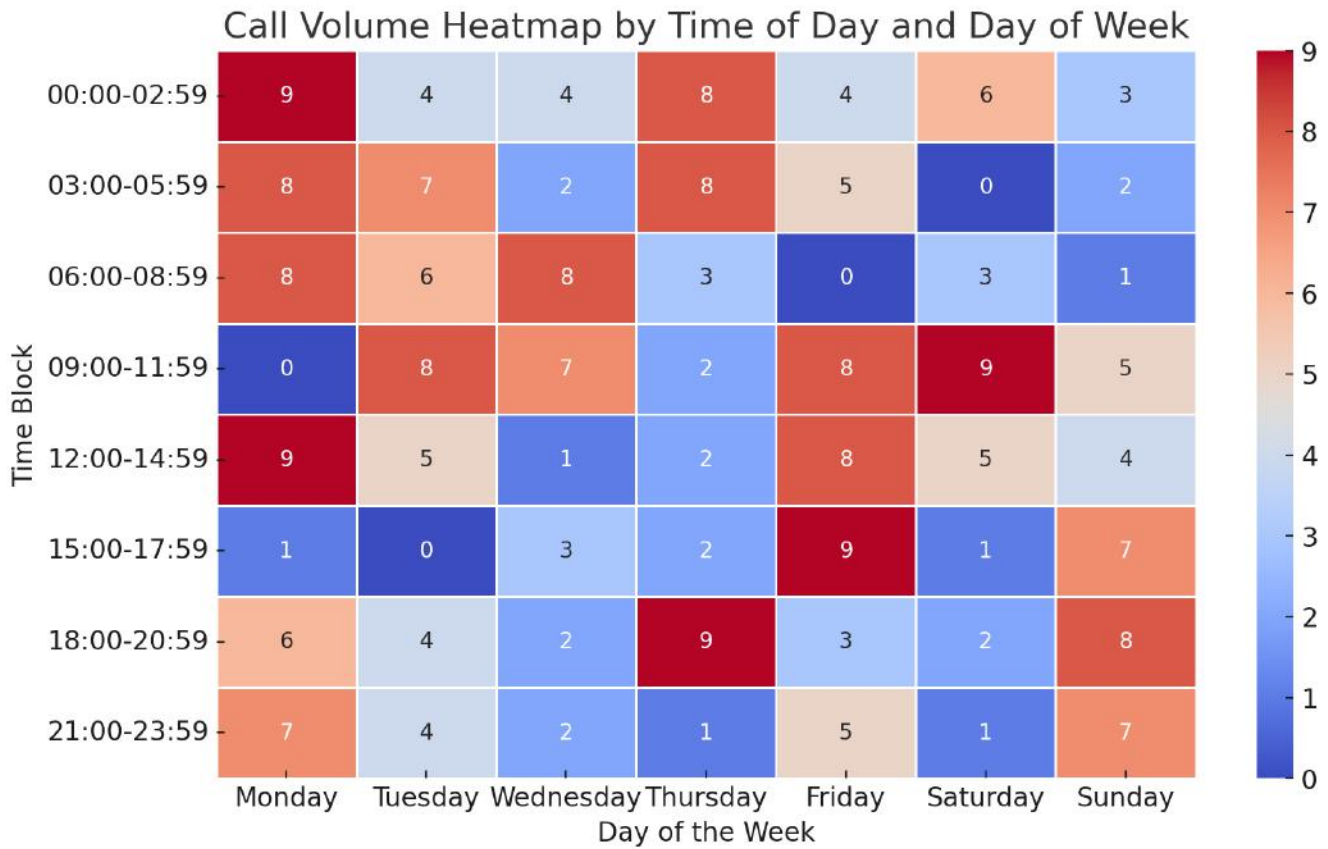
The average on task time is the average amount of time the crew is actively on an incident. This will be from the time we are dispatched/ notified to the time we go back in service.

Any box that has a "N/A" means we did not have any calls that were dispatched at that priority. All numbers are in minutes.

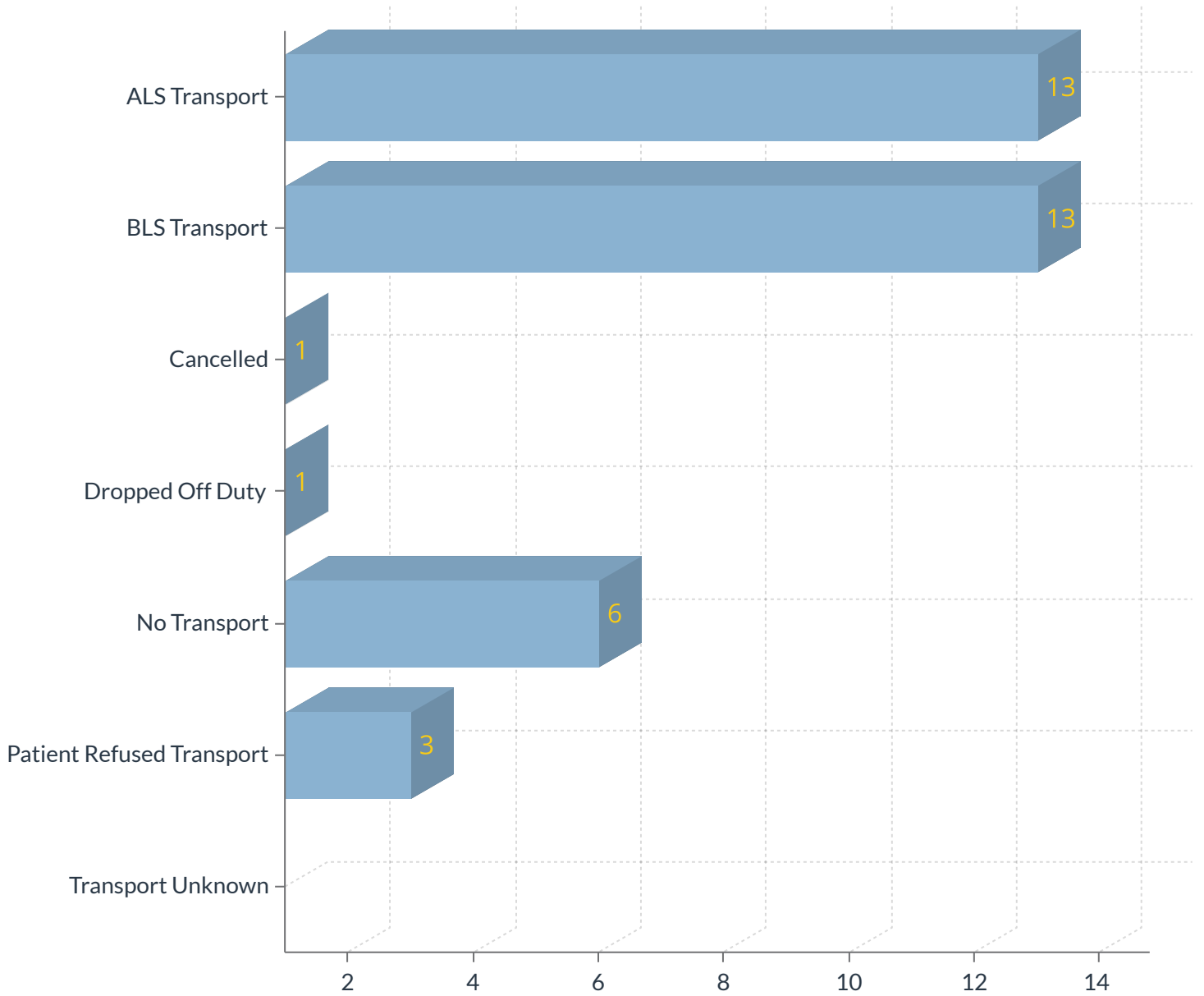

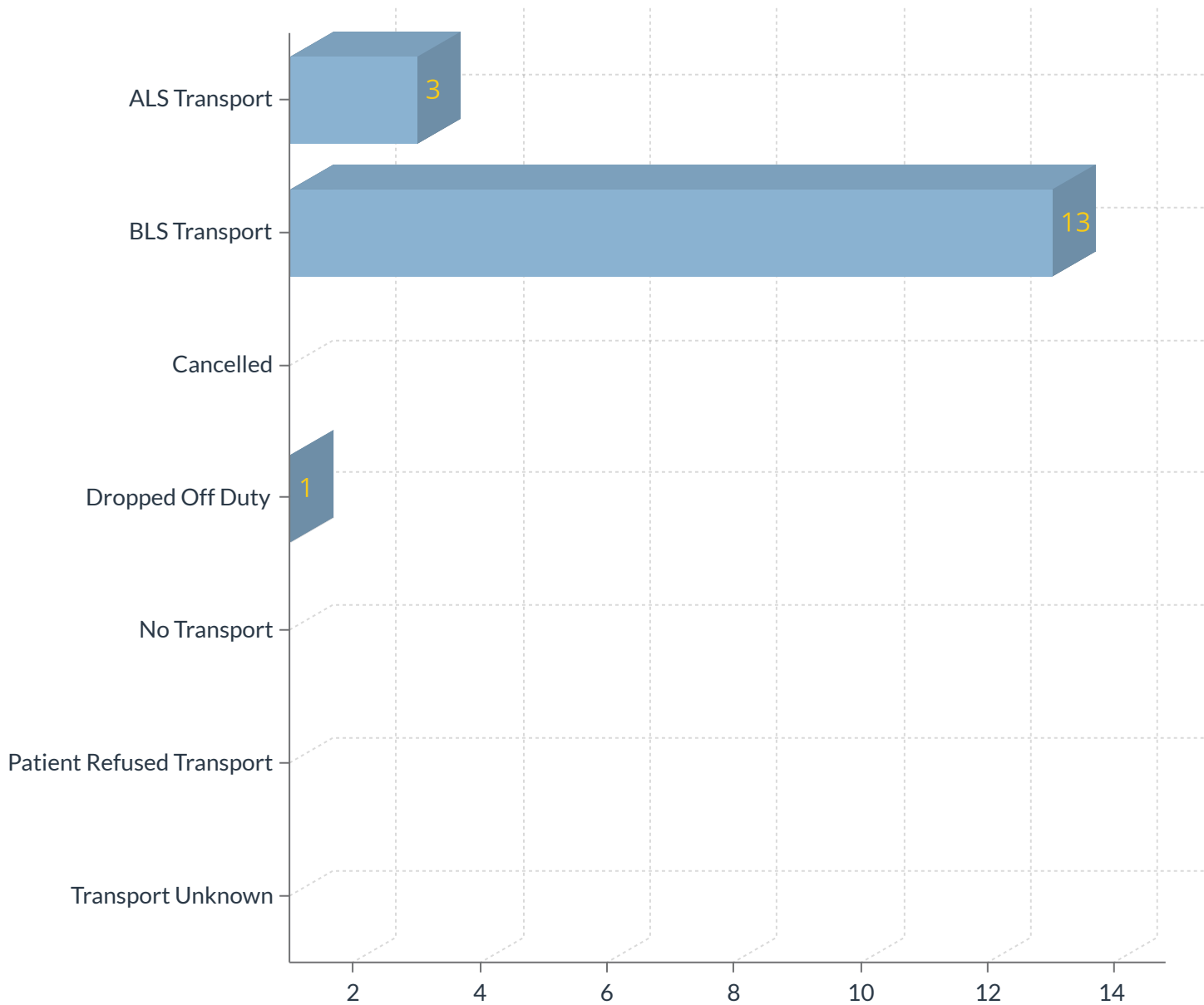
The following is data for the time of call for service. This helps show the "spread" of calls from day to night time.



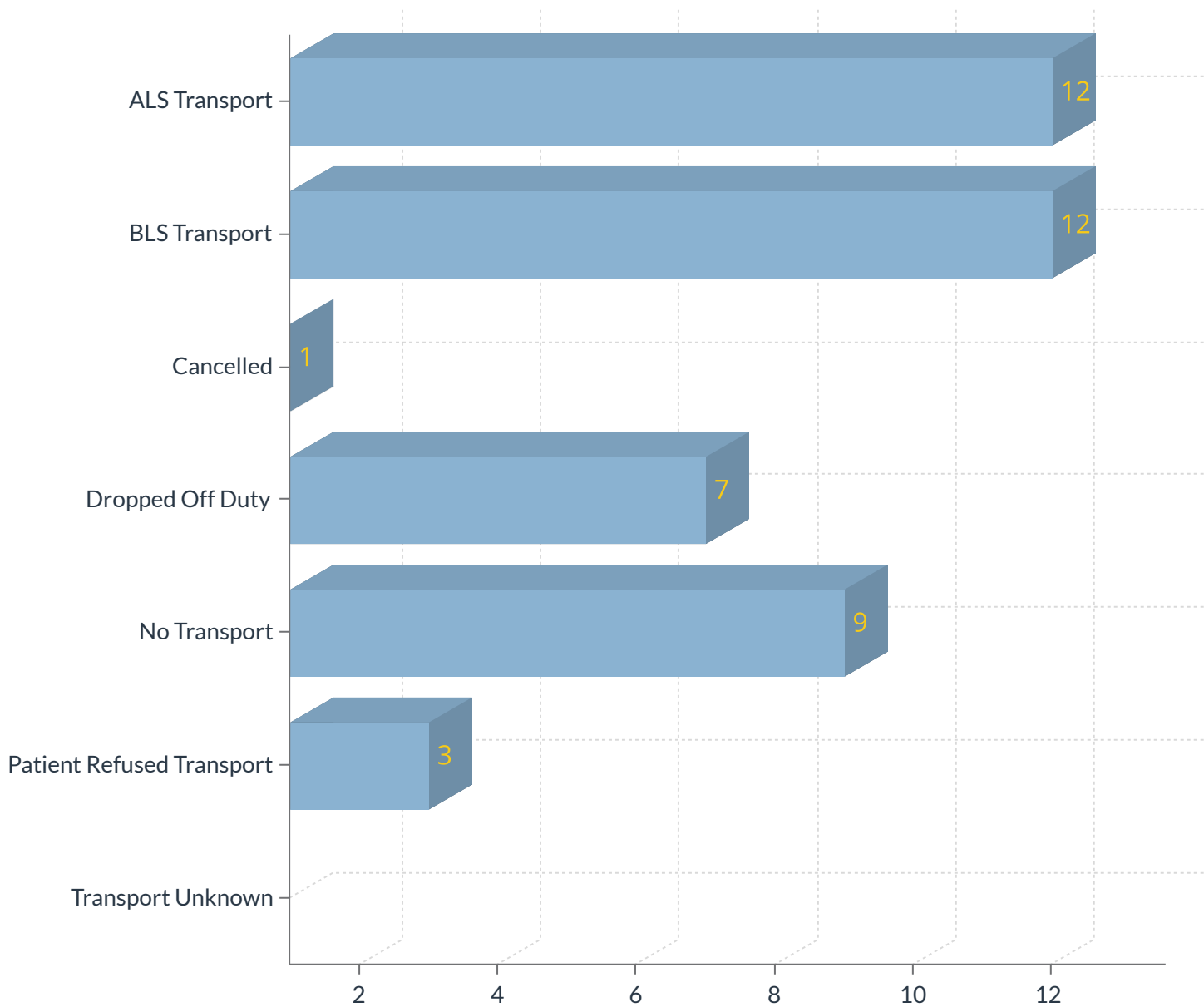
Town of Maine



Town of Nanticoke

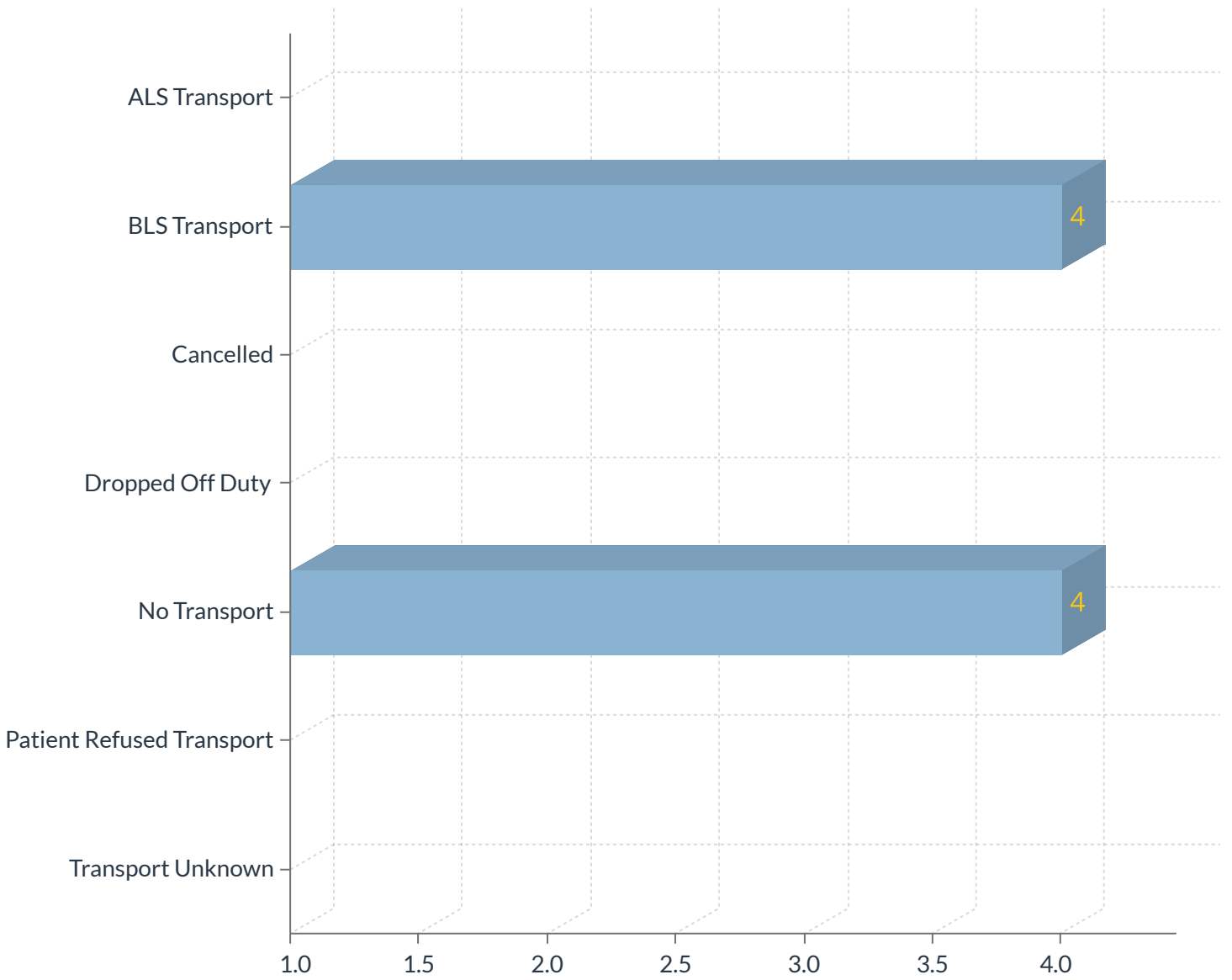


Village & Town of Newark Valley
